## Roundup 2023

**Roundup** is the biggest event for the Royal Ranger Fall camping season and is designed to be an easy and fun campout for both the boys and the leaders. This first campout of the new school year is a One Night campout that starts on Friday evening <u>September 22<sup>nd</sup></u> and concludes on Saturday, <u>September 23<sup>rd</sup> – only one night away from home</u>. <u>Lunch is NOT provided on Saturday</u>. **Roundup** is the time when we gather (or "Round up") all of the boys, pack our saddle bags and head to **The King's Camp**, **9560 Lindenwood Rd**, **Chana**, **IL** for this year's *Frontier Adventure Roundup*. This is a festive and Christ-centered campout for the men and boys from all over the northern part of our state. All boys who are in <u>grades Kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade</u> will want to join in the fun. There will be lots of old time frontier fun activities and a special speaker will minister to the boys at the evening rally and morning program. **There will be competition medals/prizes for 1<sup>st</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup>**. The camp is open on Friday for setting up your campsite. Activities start with the Friday evening rally. A special activity during the Roundup will be a Frontiersmen Camping **Fellowship (FCF) "Frontier Adventure" where boys and leaders can join FCF (see below for details).** Come as early as you can and stay as long as you can. See schedule for details.



#### Frontier Adventure Roundup Theme

Step back in time to relive the days of the mountain men and voyageurs as they explored the untamed wilderness in the American west. Setting out from St. Louis, the mountain men trekked to the new frontier west of the Mississippi River while the voyageurs canoed up the rivers to the Illinois territory and beyond. The early American frontiersmen exemplified the spirit of adventure and courage and those Royal Rangers who are courageous enough to make the trek to the Frontier Adventure Roundup will find a weekend of adventure awaits them. For this Frontier Adventure Roundup, we will rendezvous just past the Rock River along the banks of the Kishwaukee Creek at the Frontier settlement called Kings Camp. The smell of wood smoke and savory cooking will drift through the forest as you canoe or follow a dusty trail to a remote part of the settlement where you will see a group of bright white tipis and canvas shelters - the frontier village. The frontier village will be the center of our Frontier Adventure with frontier games, demonstrations, activities, competitions, campfire evening rally, morning dispatch and fun times. The frontier village will be filled with boys and men dressed in colorful frontier attire and encircled by real frontier tipis. FCF members are encouraged to wear their FCF attire during the Frontier Adventure. All those who attend will be challenged to demonstrate their frontier skills such as fire starting, tomahawk and knife throwing, archery and frontier competitions. Get ready to embark on an adventure filled weekend at the Frontier Adventure Roundup.

Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship (FCF) Membership - Join at Roundup

Do you have what it takes to be a Frontiersmen? This roundup theme is based on the lore and traditions of the frontiersmen as exemplified by the Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship (FCF). AND, you can join FCF at this Roundup by attending a special FCF Adventure which will be held Friday evening and during the daytime Saturday. Once a candidate for FCF membership completes the Royal Rangers requirements, he is eligible to attend a Frontier Adventure. Upon completion of the Frontier Adventure the candidate becomes a member of the FCF as a Frontiersmen. The Frontier Adventure and becoming a Frontiersmen also qualifies as one of the camp requirements for the Saber award. **So, you can take advantage of becoming a real FCF Frontiersmen at this roundup.** 

But, you must meet the following requirements and submit an <u>application</u> with <u>\$18 fee</u> before the Roundup to be able to participate in this FCF Frontier Adventure:

#### Boys:

- Be at least 11 years old and a graduate of the 5th grade
- Be an active member of a chartered Royal Rangers outpost.
- Complete all requirements for the following skill merits: Camping and First Aid Skills (or First Aid/CPR).

#### Leaders:

- Be at least 18 years old.
- Be an active member of a chartered Royal Rangers outpost.
- Be in good standing in your church, regularly practicing a Christlike lifestyle.
- Earn the READY and SAFETY levels of the Outpost Leader Advancement Levels of training.

## **Registration**

ALL Outposts should pre-register before Round-Up. Pre-registration is a tool that you can use with your Outpost as a planning guide for supplies, food and theme ideas. Pre-register your Outpost for this Roundup by **online** registration (and/or see your Outpost Coordinator to coordinate your registration and attendance). Go to https://ilrr.churchcenter.com/registrations and look for the

**Round-Up Registration** and register each per person and pay by credit card or Apple pay, then bring the included form to camp when onsite. If paying by check, send the attached form and payment to Paul within 7 day after filling out the online registration. Individuals should contact the event registrar if they want to pay online and qualify for multi-child family discount. Payment at camp must be Check or Cash. Credit cards cannot be processed at camp.

The registration fee for chartered Royal Ranger outposts is **\$17.00 per person**. Pre-registration forms must be postmarked by **Sept 14<sup>th</sup>**. A patch, and activities galore are included in the registration fee. **After Sept 14th**, you will have to register at the camp. If your outpost or group is <u>not chartered</u>, your fee for Round-Up will be \$22.00 per person for pre-registration and \$27.00 on site.

There will also be a multi-child family discount. For every third and subsequent immediate family member, you may deduct \$3.00 from either the pre-registration fee or the on-site fee. 90% of the pre-registration fee will be refundable up to and including Sept 17<sup>th</sup>. For Refunds, please contact the event Registrar. Recognizing that both the individual and the District need to share in the responsibility for the commitment of funds for planning this event, no refunds can be made for cancellations made after Sept 17<sup>th</sup>.

Whether you pre-register or you register at Round-Up, you will need to have two permission forms for each boy. Please use the enclosed form for this purpose. One form will be kept at the registration area and the other should be kept with your Outpost or group.

## Arrival At Site and Campsite Setup

When you arrive, go first to the **Registration AREA next to the Grace Center.** <u>Camping will be</u> to the right of the roadway, just past the trailers all the way to the activity field and on the left side of the roadway by Shelter C (see map attached to this packet). Final Outpost Registration and full payment of fees can be done as outlined below by the Senior Commander or his delegate once he arrives.

At the Registration Area, upon arrival at camp, the Senior Commander or his delegate should:

- 1. Complete final on-site registration, with totals of boys for each outpost group, leaders, and Dads.
- 2. Pay final registration fees.
- 3. Turn in one copy of each boy's permission slip.
- 4. Pick up a final copy of the schedule of activities to post in your camp.
- 5. Sign up your leaders who will help with individual competition games and contests.





## **Vehicles**

Only pedestrians and mules will be allowed in camp once Roundup begins. However, vehicles may be allowed at the outpost's campsite to unload gear upon arrival and to reload prior to leaving depending on weather. As soon as all the gear is unloaded/loaded, all vehicles must be moved to the designated parking areas. No ATV's are allowed at camp. Outpost equipment trailers can only be parked directly adjacent to road with each trailer wheels on a 2" X 12" board.

### **Camping Equipment**

Each Outpost will be responsible for providing its own equipment and means of shelter. Please use temporary camp craft to make your campsite comfortable as desired. Some suggested supplies are: tents, gas lanterns, flashlights, sleeping bags or bedrolls, gas stove and/or charcoal (or firewood available from King's Camp) for cooking, water containers, cooking gear, ice chests, wash pans, towels, etc.



#### <u>Fires</u>

Above ground fires can be used for cooking, warmth, atmosphere, etc. Kings Camp has requested that the provided fire rings be used. Fire rings, and fires, will be allowed in previous fire scarred areas. Each outpost should also have proper firefighting equipment in their campsite. Fires must be watched at all times by an adult or responsible person and must be put out completely before leaving the fire. Any unattended fires may be extinguished by security or Ranger Patrol. Do not go to bed with an open fire burning. **Do not leave a fire unattended! Free Firewood will be provided so DO NOT bring your own firewood.** 

## Rain and Severe Weather

Each Outpost must be equipped for all types of weather conditions. They must outfit themselves with their own rain protection. So bring plenty of rain gear, dining flies, tarps, etc. In the event of a severe weather warning, the basement of the Grace Center is the designated storm shelter with the main floor of the Grace Center used for overflow refuge.

#### **Supervision**

Each Outpost must be under the supervision of at least one experienced adult when boys are in the camp. Leaders who have an outpost on site should be camping with their boys. Men and boys sleep in separate quarters please.

#### <u>Curfew</u>

Quiet in camp will be observed from Midnight until 6:00 a.m. All boys should be in their campsite during those hours.

## <u>Clean up</u>

Royal Rangers have developed a reputation of leaving the facilities that we use as clean or cleaner than we found them. Please fill in all holes, replace any sod, and pick up the garbage around your campsite before you leave.

#### **Rally and Activity Participation**

The evening theme rally/Council Fire program and assemblies are an important part of any Royal Ranger campout. All Roundup attendees must attend all assemblies, devotions, and theme rallies. All leaders and boys are expected to participate in the scheduled events. Don't let a boy from your outpost miss an opportunity for salvation or to receive more of what God has for him. Our theme rallies/Council Fire services will be entertaining, action packed, full of energy and SHORT. They will include a special speaker who will bring a spiritual thought through dramatic presentations and storytelling.

All boys and leaders will enjoy participating in the activities, no matter how new or inexperienced the outpost might be. Individual games and activities will be open for participation by boys in all age groups.

All Leaders are requested to volunteer to assist in the games and activities for the boys. We need helpers for all the activities. We would appreciate every leader signing up to help in one of the games or activities. Fathers with young boys are not expected to help with the games and activities but instead are encouraged to accompany their son(s) to the games and activities. Please sign up at Registration to volunteer for an assignment.

#### **Schedule**

The tentative schedule of events is enclosed. A final schedule will be issued at Registration facility where the commander in charge will pick up all necessary information and complete the final registration of his outpost.

## Health and Safety

The safety of each boy and Leader is of great importance. The following are Camp Safety rules:

- 1. All boys using camp cutting tools must have a Royal Rangers cut and chop card or a toolcraft safety card.
- 2. All boys attending the Roundup must have a signed parental permission slip. Turn in one copy of your permission slip at registration and keep one at your campsite. Other general health and safety rules will be issued at the Headquarters.
- 3. Parents should complete the medical form and inform Outpost Leaders of any medical needs for their children. Medications, etc should be explained in detail to the Outpost Leaders.

No firearms, toy or real, should be brought to camp.

Designated First Aid Staff will be in camp at all times and will have two-way radios with them and can be contacted via. two-way radio located at the Registration Area.

Each Outpost should bring an Outpost First Aid Kit with them and be prepared to deal with minor injuries in the campsite.

#### Women in Camp and Special Needs

There will be no women in camp on Friday night after 11:00 p.m. until Saturday morning at 8:30 a.m. There will be a limited number of rooms available for rent for women and any adult leader with special needs. There also may be limited space available at the RV camp site for women or families with their own camper or camping equipment. Arrangements can be made, in advance through the Registrar, Paul Nottingham,. Email ptnott@att.net. All are "first come, first served".

We ask that each individual and church cover this event in prayer. Please pray for the salvation of boys and men, our speaker, safety, good weather, the staff and other leaders.

Now the rest is up to you. "Be there or be square". Remember, your attendance and participation helps make the Round-Up a success! Last minute registrations are welcome! Ask your boys to invite a friend to come with and enjoy the fun of the Roundup.

The Subscriber wishes to engage ONE HUNDRED MEN to ascend the river Missouri to its source, there to be employed for one, two or three years .- For particulars, enquire of Major Andrew Henry, near the Lead Mines, in the County of Washington, (who will ascend with and command the party) or to the subscriber at St. Louis.

This was the advertisement that was placed in the St. Louis paper in 1822 by Major William Ashley who would go on to start the Rocky Mountain Fur Company. This ad would draw over 150 rugged men to the endeavor, and it would shape some of the most famous Mountainmen known today: Jedediah Smith, Jim Beckworth, Hugh Glass, Joe Meek and Kit Carson.

The idea that they were going to be away from home and family for a year or more was not a deterrent to them. Their hearts yearned for adventure, and this was their opportunity]. The vast untamed wilderness called to their adventurous spirits.

Using the sign off page in this workbook, make sure that you have completed all of the requirements for FCF membership.



You will experience fun and accomplishment and will get a glimpse into the life of the American frontiersmen. The ultimate goal is for you to join the undaunted brotherhood of the FCF and start a lifelong journey towards living the wilderness experience.


## The King's Camp Directions

Kings Camp is located near Route 72 west of Interstate I-39/US 51 9560 Lindenwood Rd Chana, IL 61015 <u>http://www.kings-camp.org</u> Phone: 815-645-8277

FROM CHICAGO AREA Via I-88 or I-80: Take either I-88 or I-80 (west) to Interstate 39. Go North on I-39/US 51 toward Rockford to Exit 104, Illinois 64 toward Oregon. Turn left onto IL-64 west for 7.9 miles to S. Meridian Rd. Turn right onto S. Meridian Rd and go 2.0 miles to E. Lindenwood Rd. Turn right onto E. Lindenwood Rd and King's Camp will be on the left in 0.7 miles.

FROM CHICAGO VIA ROUTE 72: Take Golf Road Route 58 (west) to Route 72 (Higgins Road). Turn right on Route 72. At West Dundee the road will curve left just before the downtown area intersecting with Route 68 (Dundee Road.) Continuing on Route 72, there is a stop light at Routes 72/Route 47 turn left on Route 72, you will be going south for 1/4 mile. The two routes will travel together. After going under a viaduct you will come to another stop light where Route 72 and Route 47 splits. Make a right and continue on Route 72 (west). On Route 72 you will go through the towns of Hampshire, Genoa, Kingston, Kirkland, and Monroe Center. You will come to US 251. This is a stop sign, cross over US 251 to Meridian Road (*approx. 5.0 miles*). Make a left on Meridan Road (south). (Note: if you go into the Town of Stillman Valley you have gone too far.) Take Meridian Road to Lindenwood Road (*approx. 5.0 miles*). You will see a single, blue International Harvestore grain storage silo on the right side of Lindenwood Road. Make a left (east) onto Lindenwood Road (*approx. 0.5 miles*). The entrance of King's Camp is on the left.

CHICAGO VIA TOLLWAY: Take NW Tollway (I-90) west towards Rockford to US Route 20 (approx. 60 miles.) Near Rockford you will pass the DaimlerChrysler Plant on the right. Take a right exit at "Route 20 to Freeport/Route 39 South". At this exit make a right up and over the I-90 and pass MagicWaters Park on your right. Stay on Route 20 until you see the exit for "Route 39 South to Bloomington/Normal" (approx. 2.6 miles). Take Route 39 to Route 72 (approx. 9 miles). Exit to the right onto Route 72 (west) until you approach a stop sign at US 251 (approx. 2.6 miles). Cross over US 251 to Meridian Road (approx. 5.0 miles). Make a left on Meridan Road (south). (Note: if you go into the Town of Stillman Valley you have gone too far.) Take Meridian Road to Lindenwood Road (approx. 5.0 miles). You will see a single, blue International Harvestore grain storage silo on the right side of Lindenwood Road. Make a left (east) onto Lindenwood Road (approx. 0.5 miles). The entrance of King's Camp is on the left.


